# SAGINAW COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS SUMMARY OF OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS JUNE 17, 2025 SESSION

The June Session of the Board of Commissioners of Saginaw County, Michigan convened at 5:08 p.m. on Tuesday, June 17, 2025 at the Saginaw County Courthouse, 111 S. Michigan Ave., Saginaw, MI 48602 with the Honorable Jack B. Tany in the Chair.
