MEETING MINUTES

I. CALL TO ORDER/ROLL CALL: Chair Slodowski called the meeting to order at 4:35PM.

II. PUBLIC COMMENT:

1. Board of Commissioner Chairman Chris Boyd welcomed Rachel Horton, who will be taking the role of Director at Bonnie Kanicki's departure on January 31, 2024.
2. Stacey Bauer – SCACCRC Volunteer: Voiced concern over the surgical center funding and asked what can volunteers do to help. Could the shelter put out an agenda of events?
3. Dawn Spooner – SCACCRC Volunteer: Volunteers do not have enough time to take all the dogs out, do laundry, do dishes, and kennel cleaning. There is not enough staff for the building, which is 3 times the size of the old shelter. Voiced concern that the hours are not conducive to adoptions and would like extended hours, Saturday's or 1 day a week.
4. Patty Longoria – SCACCRC Volunteer: Frustrated by lack of movement by the Council regarding the surgical center and the cruelty investigator being let go. Will ACO's continue to be deputized? Does anyone on the Council volunteer? Can the Council initiate a back yard breeding ban? Hours are concerning for those who cannot get there during business hours.
5. Rachel Horton – SCACCRC Director: Bonnie has done an excellent job. Work background is at animal control in Lapeer and was hired knowing that public relations was a large part of the job. This is also the case here. Started 2 nonprofits in Lapeer and brought the volunteers to over 60. Looking to grow this facility.
6. Lori Brown – SCACCRC Volunteer: The hours are not conducive to adoptions, why can't the shelter be open late 1 day a week or Saturday? There are dogs who have been there for 2 years, and they will be euthanized. The County is closed on "rinky dink" holiday's so people cannot come on their days off. Chairman Slodowski asked if these were always the hours of the shelter. Director Kanicki responded that they did try extended hours, but the turnout did not justify it.
7. Christine Sawyer – SCACCRC Volunteer: Manages the cat portion of Facebook and what most people do not realize, is that volunteering is largely cleaning kennels, feeding, and trash. It takes 3-4 people 4-6 hours to clean the cat adoption area and 2 stray rooms. Staff cleans the isolation room. Staff would not have time if not for the volunteers. Husband works at Saginaw ISD and every building has cleaning staff, why doesn't the shelter? Staffing is a huge issue.

8. Deby Madrigal – Does not live in Saginaw County but volunteers at her local shelter. Admiration for Bonnie, staff volunteers. The shelter she volunteers at has maintenance staff. They need help, is there any way to help?

III. **APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES OF DECEMBER 20, 2023:** Meeting minutes were amended in Section VI. 5 to correct a grammatical error. Member Winiecke made a motion to approve the December 20, 2023 amended meeting minutes. Member McIntyre supported. Motion passed (9-0).

IV. **OPEN ISSUES:**

1. **Election of Chair, Vice-Chair, Secretary:** According to Article V. Section 5.1 “The officers of the Council shall be elected by a simple majority of the Council members and shall be Chair, Vice Chair, and a Secretary. The Council may also elect one Assistant Secretary”.
 - I. **Chairman** – Member Brown made a motion to nominate Tracey Slodowski to the seat of Chairman. Member Winiecke supported. Motion passed (9-0).
 - II. **Vice-Chair** – Member Slodowski made a motion to nominate Kelly Scorsone to the seat of Vice-Chair. Member McIntyre supported. Motion passed (9-0).
 - III. **Secretary** – Member Slodowski made a motion to nominate Tammy Brown to the seat of Secretary. Member Winiecke supported. Motion passed (9-0).
2. **Bylaw Changes Approved:** Bylaws 3.1, 3.4, 3.5, 3.6, 4.7, were presented to the Courts and Public Safety Committee and approved by the Full Board. Article VI. section 6.1 was recommended to go to civil counsel for review. This has been completed and bylaw 6.1 will go back to the board in February for approval.

V. **Director’s Report: Bonnie Kanicki**

1. **Staffing Challenges:** This building is three times the size, I can staff 5 Kennel Aides, but the need is 7 or 8. Saturday we had 3 people working. They clean and do meet and greets non-stop. They cannot volunteer to work in a position we have to pay them for, meaning they cannot volunteer to work extended hours or adoption events.
2. **Extended Hours:** This was tried before but there was not enough traffic to warrant it.
3. **Veterinarian** – Introduction to Dr. Mielke. Budget cannot afford a vet more than 4 hours a week. Dr. Mielke has been helping by doing rabies vaccinations and is interested in appointment to the Council.
4. **Lara License:** License expires January 31, 2024. We cannot have controlled substance after January 31, as of now the plan is to remove them offsite to Dr. Kline’s clinic. Federal DEA license is good until June 2024. Working to expedite the LARA licensing now since Rachel has been hired.
5. **ACO’s:** When Bonnie was hired, she asked that ACO’s be deputized so cruelty cases could be worked. The ACO’s have served 200s search warrants. Sheriff revoked deputization across the county and on January 12, 2024 ACOs were disarmed. Some PD will not exit car on dog calls. ACO’s are outfitted with batons, mace, and knives. There are currently 53 calls for service and the police chiefs admitted they could not up with that call volume. When ACO’s do not respond, all hell breaks loose in the County. What we can afford is not what the county demands.
6. **King’s Communication:** Started using them as an answering service, effective now.
7. **Utilities:** Concerned about rising costs, Sep-Oct power and gas went up \$2500 a month. Dec-Jan will more than likely be about 10K. In this room there is no heat now, thermostat went out. Jaime has been keeping a list of concerns.

8. **Surgical Center:** This needs to be what the community was promised. Bonnie wrote grants for this project and there is now \$121K of equipment that is collecting dust. County residents believe this will be a low cost spay and neuter clinic.
9. **MDOC:** Contract renewed 6 dogs will go to Freeland prison on a foster to adopt status. 1 dog to 2 prisoners.
10. **Volunteers:** We take every single one that can help.
11. **PA System:** We need a system; we are shouting down the hallway. In a true emergency, the police are called for backup and staff know that we use the verbal alarm code "1312 Gratiot". A new system is \$17K...possible fundraising?
12. **Reception -** Bought desks for staff. Asked for \$75K for furniture. \$7K left, had to be used somewhere else. Received a donation of \$25K and used it to buy desks. Asked for reception to be behind security glass, the lock mechanism was not safe, had to have it changed out. Had to purchase task chairs to accommodate the desk height.
13. **Chairman Slodowski:** Thank you to Bonnie, on behalf of Saginaw County, we know that you and your staff are overwhelmed at the amount of work you do.
14. **Member Fleming:** We all know what animal control was like before, resources are thin, but we need to keep ACO's safe.

BYLAWS

SAGINAW COUNTY ANIMAL CONTROL ADVISORY COUNCIL

ARTICLE I - OFFICES

SECTION 1.1 Title of Council. The title of the Council shall be the Animal Control Advisory Council, hereinafter referred to as "Council," which is a Council appointed by the Board of Commissioners, Saginaw County, Michigan, with offices located at 111 South Michigan Avenue, Saginaw, Michigan, 48602.

ARTICLE II - PURPOSE OF THE COUNCIL

SECTION 2.1 General Purpose and Goals. The primary function of the Council is that of an advisory board to the Saginaw County Animal Control Department and the Saginaw County Commissioners, in matters concerning the animals of this community. It is the goal of this Council to foster healthy, constructive relationships between the public, the Animal Control Department, veterinarians, private animal welfare groups, individuals involved in agriculture, and any other individual or group who interact with animals on a regular basis.

ARTICLE III - MEETINGS OF COUNCIL

SECTION 3.1 Place of Meetings. All meetings of the Council shall be held at the Saginaw County Animal Care & Control Resource Center, 5615 Bay Road, Saginaw, MI 48604, except by majority vote at a Council meeting, members may change the location of the meetings from time to time.

SECTION 3.2 Annual Meetings. The annual meeting of the Council for the election of the officers and for the transaction of such other business as may come before the Council shall be held in the month of January, each year, commencing with January, 1993 or such other date as may be set by the Council members.

SECTION 3.3 Special Meetings. A special meeting of the Council for any purpose or purposes, unless otherwise prescribed herein, may be called at any time by the Chair and shall be called by the Chair or by the Secretary upon the written request of a majority of the Council members. Business transacted at any such special meeting shall be limited to the purposes stated in the notice thereof.

SECTION 3.4 Regular Meetings. Regular meetings of the Council shall be held monthly January through December with the exception of July for the purpose of conducting the business posted on the agenda, and other business as Council member's request.

SECTION 3.5 Notice of Meetings. Except as otherwise provided herein, notice of each meeting of the Council, whether annual, regular or special, shall be given not less than twenty four hours nor more than twenty five days before the day on which the meeting is to be held to each Council member via email or if no email address exists, addressed to their post office address furnished to the Secretary for such purpose.

Every such notice shall state the time and place of the meeting and, in the case of special meetings, the purpose or purposes of such special meeting. Notice of any adjourned meeting shall be required to be given, unless otherwise provided in these Bylaws. All meetings shall comply with the Open Meetings Act, Act 267 of 1976.

SECTION 3.6 Quorum. At any meeting of the Council, six members shall constitute a quorum.

SECTION 3.7 Organization. At each meeting the Secretary or, in his/her absence, an appointee of the Chair shall act as Secretary of the meeting.

SECTION 3.8 Voting. Except as otherwise required by these Bylaws, each Council member is entitled to vote on any matter at a meeting of the Council on all issues voted upon at such meetings. The vote shall be decided by a majority of the votes cast by the members present.

SECTION 3.9 Conduct of Members. Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall be observed in conduct or the meeting of the Council, unless otherwise provided in these Bylaws.

ARTICLE IV - MEMBERSHIP OF COUNCIL

SECTION 4.1 Number and Term. The number of members shall be 11 but may from time to time be changed by the Saginaw County Board of Commissioners. Members shall be appointed by the Chair of the Saginaw County Board of Commissioners and shall hold office for a period of three years. After fulfilling a term, a member may be reappointed or replaced by the Chair of the Board of Commissioners.

SECTION 4.2 Resignation. Any member of the Council may resign at any time by giving written notice to the Chair of the Board of Commissioners and the Chair of the Saginaw County Animal Control Advisory Council. The resignation of any member shall take effect at the time specified therein; and, unless otherwise specified therein, the acceptance of such resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective.

SECTION 4.3 Removal. At any meeting of the Council, the members may, by a vote of a two-thirds majority of a quorum, recommend to the Chair of the Board of Commissioners that a member be removed from the Council, for just cause stated in the recommendation. The final decision on whether to implement a removal shall be the responsibility of the Chair of the Board of Commissioners.

SECTION 4.4 Vacancies. Except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws, vacancies in the membership of the Council shall be filled by the Chair of the Board of Commissioners. The Chair of the Board of Commissioners may consider a recommendation reached through a majority vote of the Council. Any midterm vacancies will be filled for the remainder of the term.

SECTION 4.5 Compensation. There shall be no compensation for serving on the Saginaw County Animal Control Advisory Council.

SECTION 4.6 Committees. The Chair of the Council may designate two or more members to constitute a subcommittee which may study specific issues and make recommendations to the full Council to consider.

SECTION 4.7 Neglect of Duties: If any Council member has missed three regularly scheduled Council meetings in a calendar year, the Advisory Council Chairperson shall notify the County Board of Commissioners in writing of this fact and request that the Chair of the Board of Commissioners institute removal of membership.

ARTICLE V - OFFICERS

SECTION 5.1 Number and Election. The officers of the Council shall be elected by a simple majority of the Council members and shall be a Chair, Vice Chair and a Secretary. The Council may also elect one Assistant Secretary.

SECTION 5.2 Term of Office. The officers shall be elected by the membership of the Council at the annual meeting of the Council. Each officer shall hold office until the next annual election of officers or until he/she shall resign, or until he/she shall have been removed as provided for in these Bylaws.

SECTION 5.3 Removal. Any officer may be removed, with cause, by the vote of a two-thirds majority of the whole Council. The removal shall only serve to replace that officer however and shall not constitute removal from membership of the Council.

SECTION 5.4 Resignation. Any officer may resign at any time giving notice in writing to the Council through the Secretary. Any such resignation shall take effect at the time specified therein; and unless specified therein, the acceptance of such resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective.

SECTION 5.5 Vacancies. A vacancy in any office shall be filled for the unexpired portion of the term by the Council.

SECTION 5.6 The Chair. The Chair shall preside over all meetings, determine agendas, and perform such other duties as necessary.

SECTION 5.7 Vice-Chair. The Vice-Chair shall perform the duties of the Chair in his/her absence.

SECTION 5.8 The Secretary. The Secretary shall record or cause to be recorded all the proceedings of the meetings of the Council and shall see that all notices are duly given in accordance with the provisions of these Bylaws. The Secretary shall keep or cause to be kept all records for the Council.

ARTICLE VI-AMENDMENTS

SECTION 6.1 These Bylaws may be altered, amended, or repealed, and new Bylaws may be adopted, at any meeting of the Council, after all members have received through email or regular mailing, the proposed changes to the Bylaws at least ten days in advance of the meeting they are to be considered. Changes to the Bylaws require six votes. The Bylaws shall first be approved by Council and then forwarded to the Board of Commissioners for final approval.

Hi Bonnie,

That is a great question! Technically, the dollar amount established for renting out your training room would be a recommendation from you to the Board of Commissioners as an amendment to the County's Fee Schedule. (That is only because there isn't a current fee established and you would definitely have a say in recommending that dollar amount.) Also, not sure if you want to involve your Advisory Committee in this discussion and recommendation, but that would be entirely up to you.

The fee could also be established at a lower rate if it is a County department versus an external organization, but again, that would be entirely up to you as a part of your recommendation.

As for a rate to recommend, I honestly have no basis to offer a recommendation. However, I can tell you that the Board Chambers and Committee Rooms are rented at \$100 for a half day (1-4 hours) and \$200 for a full day (4-8 hours) with a \$50 cancellation fee.
