## PARENTING TIME SCHEDULE

Both parties shall work towards reasonable parenting time during any periods of time which are mutually agreeable to the parties. In the event of disagreement, parenting time will be alternate Saturdays from noon until 6:00 p.m. following entry of this order, and the following Holiday schedule:

## HOLIDAY PARENTING TIME SCHEDULE

If the parties cannot reach an agreement, they must follow the holiday parenting time schedule stated below. The holiday schedule takes precedence over any other parenting time schedule.

- 1. In odd-numbered years, Defendant shall have the minor child(ren) on Easter, Christmas Day, and Halloween.
- 2. In odd-numbered years, Plaintiff shall have the minor child(ren) on Thanksgiving, Christmas Eve, and the child(ren)'s birthdays.
- 3. In even-numbered years, Defendant shall have the minor child(ren) on Thanksgiving, Christmas Eve, and the child(ren)'s birthdays
- 4. In even-numbered years, Plaintiff shall have the minor child(ren) on Easter, Christmas Day, and Halloween.
- 5. Each year, the mother shall have the minor child(ren) on Mother's Day.
- 6. Each year, the father shall have the minor child(ren) on Father's Day.

## Hours for Holidays:

- 1. Easter: 9:00 a.m.to 6:00 p.m.
- 2. Halloween: 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. (if age eleven and under only)
- 3. Thanksgiving: 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- 4. Christmas Eve: noon to 9:00 p.m.
- 5. Christmas Day: 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.
- 6. Child(ren)'s Birthdays (which includes all of the parties' minor children subject to this order on each child's birthday): noon to 7:00 p.m. on non-school days and 5:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. on school days; if the child's birthday falls on a holiday designated in this schedule, the holiday takes precedence over the birthday
- 7. Mother's Day: 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.
- 8. Father's Day: 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.
