


Recreation Station Newsletter A Message from Parks Director Brian Keenan-Lechel:

Saginaw County Parks wrapped up our busiest parks season ever recorded in early September, totaling 116,250 patrons between at Imerman Memorial Park and William H. Haithco Recreation Area between Memorial Day and Labor Day. This represents a 14% increase



Although our summer season has concluded, your parks remain open and accessible year-round. A full slate of park programs and partnerships keep us busy well into the fall. Two exciting projects are also beginning construction this fall. First, Imerman Memorial Park improvements will include accessible walkways, an accessible restroom addition, a canoe/kayak launch and rental kiosk system, and more. Second, a trailhead on the south end of the BayZil Trail, on the east end of Kochville Road in Zilwaukee

Township will break ground this fall. Both projects will conclude in spring/early summer '26. We hope you continue to enjoy your Saginaw County Parks this autumn and hope to see you on the trails!





Pavilion Rentals

Are you looking for a location for your special outing? We have the perfect place for any occasion! Pavilion reservations are ideal for company picnics, family or school reunions, graduation parties, birthday parties, church groups, clubs and any group that would appreciate having their outing in a beautiful Saginaw County Park. The William H. Haithco Recreation Area provides modern bathrooms, playgrounds, Ruth Averill Splash Pad, fishing docks, volleyball courts and five picnic pavilions. Imerman Memorial Park provides modern bathrooms, a fishing dock, a volleyball court, a playground, horseshoe pits, basketball and tennis courts, an in-line hockey rink, Bark Park and four picnic pavilions.

We will begin accepting 2026 pavilion reservations for the William H. Haithco Recreation Area, Imerman Memorial Park, and Price Nature Center on January 2, 2026.

Pavilion rental fees are \$75 per day for Saginaw County Residents. Park entry for Saginaw County Residents is free. Non Residents pay a\$2.00 per vehicle entry fee at Imerman Memorial Park and a \$5.00 per vehicle entry fee at the William H. Haithco Recreation Area (Memorial Day weekend thru Labor Day).

To get free entry to our parks, Saginaw County Residents can pick up a free Recreate Pass at Imerman Memorial Park, Wm. H. Haithco

Recreation Area or the Parks office. Out of county patrons may purchase a \$30 pass for a whole summer of fun!





Just a friendly reminder that dogs are permitted on a 6 ft leash at all of our county parks except the Wm. H. Haithco Recreation Area*. Imerman Memorial Park has a Dog Park where dogs are allowed off leash to romp and play with their friends. Thank you for your cooperation.

*Dogs are allowed at Haithco during our Saginaw County Parks sanctioned Soggy Doggy events in the spring and fall.
