TRANSITION PLAN UPDATE

The Saginaw County Parks and Recreation Commission has conducted an *Americans with Disabilities Act Transition Plan Update* to evaluate if services are meeting the needs of all park users and to establish policies and practices to remove physical barriers that restrict use. The goal is to ensure for safe and accessible facilities and programs, while also ensuring that all services comply with all state, local and federal accessibility standards.

The *Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)*, as enacted on July 26, 1990, is a federal civil rights law that provides protection against discrimination by public and private entities for all persons with disabilities. A disability is defined by the ADA as any physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities. The legislation mandates that qualified disabled individuals shall not be excluded from participation in, denied the benefit of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program, service or activity. The Act also provides certain protections for employees with disabilities and requires employers to make reasonable accommodations for applicants and employees with disabilities.

The ADA is divided into five parts and addresses the following areas:

- Title I: Employment
- Title II: Public Services
- Title III: Public Accommodations
- Title IV: Telecommunications
- Title V: Miscellaneous Provisions

Title II of the act prohibits state and local government from discriminating against persons with disabilities, or from excluding their participation in activities, as well as denying to them the benefits of programs and services. The Saginaw County Parks Transition Plan Update adhered to the standards as established by Title II and amended in 2010. The purpose of the Plan is to identify barriers to accessibility currently existing in parks-related services and to provide physical or structural remedies that comply with the non-discrimination policies described in Title II of the ADA.

Saginaw County previously prepared a Transition Plan for general governmental services that was adopted in 1998. That plan included services provided by Saginaw County Parks. This update was undertaken to determine the current state of accessibility, identify improvements to meet a broader spectrum of disability needs, and address additional recreation compliance issues established by the amended ADA standards pertinent to recreational services. The updated standards established in 2010 were not considered in the County Parks Transition Plan adopted in 1998.

Public agencies are required to prepare a Transition Plan if physical or structural facility modifications are required to provide access to programs or services. While the Transition Plan is limited to evaluating physical barriers, an analysis of programs and services is important for determining if physical changes are required. The Plan further documents any actions that are necessary to alter the facilities. The ADA does not require public entities to make all existing facilities accessible, nor to fundamentally alter the nature of services, programs and activities. It also does not require public entities to implement standards defined by the Act in a manner that would create undue financial and administrative burdens.

Optional solutions to providing program accessibility in lieu of making actual physical changes to facilities may be appropriate and acceptable under ADA guidelines. In such cases the solution must be compliant with ADA procedures and documented.

ADA guidelines were researched in preparation for undertaking this initiative and the process of developing a plan utilized resources available from the New England ADA Center, www.newenglandada.org which is a project created by the Institute of Human Centered Design and a member of the ADA National Network. The New England ADA Center was chosen because of the comprehensive resources, which are available on a “free to use” basis, for purposes of undertaking and conducting a complete planning and implementation process. The planning process incorporated the following action steps:

1. Start Implementation
2. Appoint an ADA Coordinator
3. Provide Public Notice
4. Adopt a Grievance Procedure
5. Conduct a Self-Evaluation
6. Develop a Transition Plan
7. Create an Action Plan

IMPLEMENTATION

Public participation is required throughout the development of *Transition Plans*. In addition to providing information about the plan and its applicability to programs and services offered, public entities must also provide opportunities for public input. Individuals and organizations, including those representing disabled populations, can participate in the development of the plan by submitting comments and specific recommendations. The Saginaw County Parks Commission initiated the first action to begin developing the Transition Plan Update by appointing a sub-committee to lead, organize and monitor the process. That committee was chaired by two Commissioners and included Parks Staff. In addition, a search immediately began to identify and recruit individuals and organizations representing disabled populations to participate on that committee. Continuing efforts were made to identify and recruit additional members to the committee, and in particular handicapped individuals and individuals representing a variety of handicap organizations. An objective and desired outcome of this initiative was to take a more comprehensive approach to identifying and addressing barriers to accessibility. That required the expertise of committee members who could help to evaluate programs and services and represent a variety of disability needs. Meetings were scheduled on a monthly basis to provide planning process updates, as well as an opportunity for input from committee members.

APPOINT ADA COORDINATOR

The Saginaw County Parks Director will serve as the Saginaw County Parks and Recreation ADA Coordinator. The primary roles of the ADA Coordinator are as follows:

- Serves as the primary point of contact for ADA compliance for Saginaw County Parks and Recreation services.
- Plans and coordinates compliance efforts and oversees and ensures that ADA standards and guidelines are met for delivering services and removing barriers to accessibility.
- Trains staff regarding ADA requirements
- Responds to general inquiries from the public and coordinates requests for auxiliary aids and services, along with reasonable modifications of policies, practices and procedures.
- Manages a grievance procedure, investigates complaints and maintains records.

Contact information for the ADA Coordinator will be posted on the website, Facebook page, Newsletter and printed materials promoting programs.

PROVIDE PUBLIC NOTICE

Publicity for the Transition Plan Update was undertaken in a variety of ways. Individuals and organizations representing disabled populations were contacted and invited to participate on the ad-hoc Committee. Committee members were encouraged to help promote the planning process and identify potential new members. Details of the planning process were included in the summer edition of the County's Park & Recreation Newsletter, Facebook Page and Website. The Transition Plan was published on the Saginaw County website for public review and information was provided for submitting comments to the ADA Coordinator for the County Parks. Notices of public meetings pertinent to the plan was also posted on the County's websites.

ADOPT A GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

The grievance procedure adopted for Saginaw County Parks and Recreation is attached in the *Appendix as Exhibit 1*. A copy of the grievance form is available on the Parks website along with the name and contact information for the ADA Coordinator.

CONDUCT A SELF EVALUATION

A key component of the Transition Plan is the ADA Self- Assessment. A checklist was adopted for purposes of conducting the self-assessment of County park facilities and programs. The checklist was produced by the New England ADA Center and is based on the revised Title II standards established in 2010. These standards were used to evaluate accessibility to programs and facilities and the removal of barriers. The ADA requires units of governments to ensure that services, programs and activities, when viewed in their entirety, are accessible to people with disabilities and provided on an equal basis. The self-assessment checklist sections used in the self-evaluation survey included the following:

- Approach & Entrance (Parking and accessible routes)
- Access to Goods & Services (Office operations)
- Toilet Rooms
- Additional Access (Telephones, Drinking Fountains, Signage)
- Fishing Piers & Platforms
- Play Areas
- Recreational Boating Facilities

The self-assessment survey of park facilities and programs began in February and was substantially complete in April. Parks staff participated in conducting surveys to evaluate the accessibility of park sites and related facilities and features, and to identify and document barriers. The County's six parks surveyed included: William H. Haithco, Imerman Memorial, Price Nature Center, Ringwood Forest, the Saginaw Valley Railtrail Heads at VanWormer and Strobel Roads and Veterans Memorial Park. The majority of barriers identified by the surveys related to parking, access routes and sanitary facilities. Copies of the surveys detailing the barriers are included in the *Appendix* as follows:

- *Exhibit 2* – William H. Haithco Recreation Area
- *Exhibit 3* – Imerman Memorial Park
- *Exhibit 4* – Price Nature Center

In addition to park facilities, a self-assessment of the County Governmental Building, including the Parks Administrative Office, along with organized recreation events, activities and programs was also conducted. With minor exceptions the Governmental Center and Parks Office complied with ADA standards. The exceptions related to the height and location of fixtures in the public restrooms on the lower level of the building. A copy of the self-assessment survey is included in the *Appendix – Exhibit 8*.

Saginaw County Parks actively sponsors and supports a variety of activities, events and programs throughout the year and throughout the County. In addition to County Parks, site venues also include the City of Saginaw, along with townships and villages within Saginaw County. It was determined that all program venues/locations will need to be evaluated in order to ensure that management practices and site conditions are ADA compliant. Additionally, communication methods used to advertise and promote programs and activities, along with registration and participation processes and policies will also need to

be evaluated. Based on the investigations conducted, improvements in management practices are being proposed that will ensure a higher level of compliance.

TRANSITION & ACTION PLAN

After completing the self-assessment surveys and identifying physical barriers at each park site, Parks Staff met to review the results and develop solutions to achieve compliance. Two categories were developed to mitigate barriers based on the scope and cost of the barrier identified. The Option 1 category included the removal of barriers that were readily achievable and easy to accomplish with minimal effort and expense. A decision on what was readily achievable considered the nature and cost of the access improvements needed, in light of available funding in the current fiscal year budget.

The Option 2 category listed barriers that were larger in scope, cost and complexity and could not be immediately undertaken. These barriers were assigned to a capital improvements schedule to be budgeted for future implementation as funding becomes available. The Option 2 category also included preliminary cost opinions along with an estimated date for completion (*See Appendix – Exhibit 10*).

Barriers to accessibility were documented at all six park sites. Facilities comprising the Saginaw Valley Rail Trail met the majority of compliance standards with a few minor exceptions. Barriers related to accessible routes and sanitary facilities were common issues in the remaining five parks. Handicapped accessible portajohns will be leased as an interim solution for sanitary service compliance, and units will be installed in a timely manner. In that portajohns are currently being used at all park sites, the conversion to accessible units does not add an excessive burden to the current years operating budget. Longer term solutions are being investigated to remodel the existing restrooms in the boathouse at Haithco to meet ADA standards, and construct modular pit toilets at Imerman and Price Nature Center, along with replacing the existing pit toilets at Ringwood Forest.

Accessible route barriers were a common problem and one that will require budgeted funding over time. Access routes range from minimally meeting the standard, as is the case at Haithco, to not meeting the standard at Imerman, Price Nature Center and Ringwood Forest. Accessible routes are required from compliant parking spaces to features and facilities like shelters, restrooms, play areas, game courts, etc. To meet compliance standards surface materials must be firm, stable and slip resistant. It's proposed that future accessible route improvements in County Parks be paved concrete, asphalt or wood surfaces which fully comply with ADA standards.

The cost of undertaking sanitary and accessible route improvements will require significant funding. It's anticipated that State and Federal Grant programs, as well as donations will be the primary sources for financing these future improvements. Parks staff have been successful in securing grants and donations in the past and are confident these sources represent the best opportunity for funding.

Additional accessibility improvements were considered and discussed during the course of updating the Transition Plan. Examples include constructing a new accessible canoe, boat and kayak launch at Imerman Park, a new accessible canoe and kayak launch and fishing site at Haithco, along with a walkway linkage to the adjacent Seniors Center and accessible beach and trail improvements, together with accessible trail improvements at Imerman, Price Nature Center and Ringwood Forest, and picnic facilities at Veterans Memorial Park. These proposed new features would significantly enhance services

for both handicapped visitors as well as all park users. As these improvements are in the conceptual stage, project details are not currently available.

Details of the park transition and action plans were consolidated along with the self-assessment details on the *Exhibit forms 2 thru 7* in the *Appendix*.

Improvements in recreational programming for events and activities are being implemented following an evaluation of those services. All advertising and promotional materials for events and activities, along with any required registration requirements, will provide contact information for disabled individuals to advise program sponsors/co-sponsors of any special needs they may have related to access and participation. Reasonable accommodation will be made for participation including the acquisition of certain adaptable equipment/supplies when coordinating program purchases. Consideration of these and other accessibility aids will be given during program creation, design and layout.

In addition to identifying specific criteria to guide programming efforts, County staff will work cooperatively with program partners to communicate and bring awareness to accessibility needs. A document has been prepared providing general information regarding accessibility requirements for co-sponsored events and activities at venues not owned and managed by the County. These requirements (*See Appendix – Exhibit 9*) will be shared with program co-sponsors to ensure that events and activities meet ADA compliance standards. This notice will also be included in newsletters and posted on the County Parks website.

SUMMARY

The Saginaw County Parks Commission and Parks Staff recognize the importance of providing services that meet the needs of all residents and visitors. In that regard, this planning initiative was undertaken for purposes of conducting a comprehensive evaluation of facilities, programs and administrative functions to identify shortcomings that represent barriers to accessibility as defined by the Americans with Disabilities Act. While ADA standards were used as a basis for the evaluation, the intent throughout the process was to strive for Universal Accessibility. Efforts were made to consider and be mindful of a broader range of disabilities, and to engage representatives of handicapped populations to assist in determining the needs for providing compliant services. One of the desired outcomes of this initiative is to maintain contact with handicapped individuals and agencies who could act in an advisory capacity for future matters related to improving accessibility.

The Transition Plan Update provided a unique opportunity for the Parks Commission and Parks Staff to become better educated about the needs and benefits of accessibility. It also provided an opportunity to significantly enhance the quality of services, and quality of life, for park visitors and participants of sponsored programs and services. It's clearly understood that adapting to accessibility needs will be both an ongoing process and will require a commitment to meeting the compliance standards established by the Americans with Disabilities Act.

SAGINAW COUNTY PARKS ADA TRANSITION PLAN PROPOSED CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS SUMMARY

Upon completion of the ADA self-assessment a transition plan was developed along with an action plan for removing barriers to accessibility existing in the County's five parks and rail trail facilities. The attached capital improvements schedule details the estimated costs for mitigating physical barriers to achieve compliance with standards established by the "*Americans with Disabilities Act*".

The *Americans with Disability Act (ADA)*, as enacted in 1990 and amended in 2010, is a federal civil rights law that provides protection against discrimination by public and private entities for all persons with disabilities. The legislation mandates that qualified disabled individuals shall not be excluded from participation in, denied the benefit of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program, service or activity. The recently completed transition plan update for Saginaw County Parks was undertaken to determine the current state of accessibility, identify improvements to meet a broader spectrum of disability needs, and address additional recreation compliance issues established by the amended ADA standards, which were not considered in the County Parks Transition Plan adopted in 1998.

The two major categories of improvements addressed by the transition plan include sanitary facilities and accessible routes. All five parks were found to be deficient in meeting ADA restroom standards. New sanitary facilities are proposed for Imerman, Price Nature Center and Ringwood Forest. The boat house restrooms at Haithco Park will be renovated to achieve compliance. ADA standards define accessible routes as being "firm, stable and slip resistant". All County Parks were found to be deficient in meeting the ADA standard. The transition plan proposes constructing paved asphalt or concrete walkways linking compliant parking areas to general park facilities and activities.

While required by law the removal of barriers to accessibility will provide recreational opportunities to not only underserved populations but all park users. These quality-of-life improvements are expected to elevate recreational experiences while increasing both visitation to parks and participation in programs. Additionally, the improvements will also serve to renovate aging park facilities, reduce park maintenance and enhance the regional appeal of County recreational services.

The timeline for undertaking the improvements is subject to the availability of funding, however its anticipated County Parks Staff and the Parks and Recreation Commission will take full advantage of all funding opportunities to complete the plan at the earliest possible date.

EXHIBIT 1 GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

Americans with Disabilities Act Grievance Procedure

This grievance procedure is established consistent with the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act and the Michigan Persons with Disabilities Civil Rights Act. It may be used by any qualified individual who wishes to file a complaint alleging discrimination on the basis of disability in the provision of services, activities, programs or benefits by the Saginaw County Parks and Recreation Commission.

A complaint must be made in writing and contain information about the alleged discrimination, including the name, address, phone number, and email address of the complainant, as well as the location, date, and the description of the alleged discrimination. Alternative means of filing complaints, such as personal interviews or a recording of the complaint, will be made available for persons with disabilities upon request.

The complaint should be submitted as soon as possible, but no later than 60 calendar days, after the alleged violation, and sent to:

Within 15 business days after the receipt of the complaint, the ADA Coordinator will meet with the complainant to discuss the complaint and, where applicable, possible resolutions. Within 15 business days of the meeting, the ADA Coordinator will respond in writing, or, where appropriate in another format that is accessible to the complainant, such as large print, Braille, or recorded message. The response will explain the position of the Saginaw County Parks and Recreation Commission and, where applicable, offer options for substantive resolution of the complaint.

If the response by ADA Coordinator does not satisfactorily resolve the issue, the complainant may appeal the decision within 15 business days after receipt of the response to the Saginaw County Controller or the Controller's designee.

Within 15 business days after receipt of the appeal, the Saginaw County Controller or designee will meet with the complainant to discuss the complaint and possible resolutions. Within 15 business days after the meeting, the Saginaw County Controller or designee will respond in writing, or, where appropriate, in another format that is accessible to the complainant, with a final resolution of the complaint.

Nothing outlined within this procedure is meant to supplant an individual's right to file a complaint with federal or state civil rights authorities.

EXHIBIT 10 PROGRAM ACCESSIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

SAGINAW COUNTY PARKS & RECREATION

ACCESSIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR EVENTS & ACTIVITIES PROGRAMMING

The Saginaw County Parks Commission is committed to providing safe and accessible services that meet the needs of all park users. All services provided shall comply with standards established by the "Americans With Disabilities Act" (ADA) so as not to discriminate against or deny benefits to persons with disabilities, or exclude their participation in activities. Accessibility needs shall be coordinated with program co-sponsors to meet these requirements.

Disability Defined: Any impairment that substantially limits one or more of major life activities.

RECREATION EVENTS & ACTIVITIES PROGRAMMING REQUIREMENTS

PARKING:

- Programming access begins upon arriving at the event/activity site. If arriving by vehicle ADA standards require 1 handicap space per 25 regular spaces, and 1 van accessible space for every 6 handicap spaces. If there is only 1 handicap space, it should be designated as van accessible.
- All handicap spaces should be identified with approved signage and pavement markings.
- Dedicated handicap parking spaces must be located on the shortest accessible route of travel to the event/activity.
- If dedicated ADA handicap spaces are not available, consideration should be given to providing temporary handicap spaces, identified with compliant signage.

ACCESSIBLE ROUTE:

- ADA standards stipulate that an accessible route must exist from the parking stall to the event/activity site. ADA standards further stipulate that the accessible route shall be **stable, firm and slip resistant**.

PARTICIPATION:

- Accommodations must be provided that enable participation in the event/activity. If the event is a movie for instance, is there wheelchair seating space available?

SANITARY:

- If restrooms facilities are provided, they must meet architectural handicap accessibility standards. Porta pottys can be rented to provide that service, however the vendor must ensure the units meet ADA standards. Sanitary facilities must be appropriately signed with international disabled symbols and braille.

ADVERTISING, PROMOTION & REGISTRATION:

- Event/activity promotional materials, along with any required registration process, shall provide contact information for disabled individuals to advise program sponsors/co-sponsors of any special needs they may have related to access and participation. Reasonable accommodation will be made for participation including the acquisition of certain adaptable equipment/supplies when coordinating program purchases. Consideration of these and other accessibility aids will be given during program creation, design and layout.
